Notes from Reverend Geoff Parker

I've just arrived for a few days at the Monastery of the Society of St. John the Evangelist in Cambridge, MA, as I have annually for over 6 years now. Here, I immerse myself in the brothers' pattern of worship and silence, and listen some for where God is speaking in my life and ministry. It is not always an easy visit, but it is always an important one, and so I thank you for the gift of this time.

Today has been especially warm for the end of September, and so I found myself walking along the Charles River, and spending time within the Cloistered garden. It occurs to me that I have been witnessing the growth of this place for many years, watching the ivy as it climbs the guest house... watching the native plants that the brothers have intentionally placed in the gardens to thrive in ways they cannot always in the wild now.

If we pause, if we take the time to notice, we can bear witness to growth around us, even when it happens in small and almost imperceptible ways, year after year... and we can grow by doing so.

This year, our annual appeal campaign and fall worship theme is *Growing Together: Called to Community*. Our ancestors in faith, like us, often needed metaphors and images to help them understand the community of Christ which they were striving to create and sustain. Like Jesus, many of them lived *close to the earth*. They knew the patterns and the growth of plant life: the crops which sustained them, and those things which could strangle and crowd out those gifts. So as they lived into the ministry and community of the church, they used the language of that kind of natural growth.

So do we, in these days. I hope that Foreside Community Church feels like a place where you are invited to grow in spirit and in wisdom, and where you are invited to nurture the growth of others through our ministries and community life.

In the month ahead, I invite you to reflect on how you can tend to growth of Spirit: both your own, and that of our church home. Find a sanctuary space or time which you can claim... to listen for what may be growing in your life: your visions, your hopes, your questions, your deep needs and challenges. I'll be providing a small prayer practice each week to guide us in this reflection.

I would also ask you to reflect on what is growing here at church. Soon, we will have been in ministry together for a full year. I give thanks for the chance to serve God with you every day. As you pray, and as you consider your pledge for the next year, I hope that you will seek those signs of our Spiritual growth together as the church, and the essential "rooted-ness" that you may be being called to support with your gift. Above all, I hope you know how thankful I am for the gift of every one of you... and know that, whatever the size, the joy and spirit with which a gift is given is more precious.

This month, I invite you to join us on **Sunday mornings** when we'll hear from some of our members why they love this place, and how they grow here, and hope to nurture others in the same. I invite you to **Wednesday Evening Prayers** to be refreshed in quiet and in candlelight. I invite you to gather in the fullness of community and service at the annual **Falmouth Community Dinner**.

Most of all, I invite you to simply notice all of the wonderful gifts of the Spirit in this place and within yourself. I give thanks for *that* invitation, for it is not mine, but Jesus's... and it calls us to pause... to notice... and to grow in God's grace and compassion. Thanks be to God.

The Gorham Savings Bank Maine Marathon is a [Maine Track Club](#) event. Founded in 1979, the non-profit, all-volunteer Maine Track Club is Maine's largest and most active running club. The 2019 event will be the 28th edition — making this one of the longest running marathon events in New England. Volunteers act as race directors as well as handle the logistics of race day, organizing the expo, helping to find sponsors and more. **Once again, FCC's Fellowship Ministry chaired by Colleen Hutchinson will host a refreshment stop at the end of the driveway, and the church itself will serve as a potential evacuation site if needed. Live music will also be provided on the church grounds.** The event is committed to giving back to the community through charitable giving. Since 1997, the Maine Marathon, Half Marathon and Marathon Relay and its participants have raised more than \$4,700,000 for charity.

The 2019 beneficiaries are Eastern Trail Alliance, Girls on the Run, Portland Community Squash, Rippleffect and WinterKids.

We never run out of things to talk about and learn so much from each other. For October we have decided to read The Murmur of Bees by Sofia Segovia. This is a new book and is getting rave reviews for its beautiful and lyrical writing. Summary follows:

From a beguiling voice in Mexican fiction comes an astonishing novel—her first to be translated into English—about a mysterious child with the power to change a family's history in a country on the verge of revolution.

From the day that old Nana Reja found a baby abandoned under a bridge, the life of a small Mexican town forever changed.

Disfigured and covered in a blanket of bees, little Simonopio is for some locals the stuff of superstition, a child kissed by the devil. But he is welcomed by landowners Francisco and Beatriz Morales, who adopt him and care for him as if he were their own. As he grows up, Simonopio becomes a cause for wonder to the Morales family, because when the uncannily gifted child closes his eyes, he can see what no one else can—visions of all that's yet to come, both beautiful and dangerous. Followed by his protective swarm of bees and living to deliver his adoptive family from threats—both human and those of nature—Simonopio's purpose in Linares will, in time, be divined. Set against the backdrop of the Mexican Revolution and the devastating influenza of 1918, The Murmur of Bees captures both the fate of a country in flux and the destiny of one family that has put their love, faith, and future in the unbelievable. This renewed campaign - a long term, grass roots movement - aims to turn our nation's attention to five endemic ills: Systemic Racism, Poverty and Inequality, War Economy and Militarism, Ecological Devastation, and National Morality.

The National Co-Chairs of the Campaign, The Rev. Dr. William Barber, II and The Rev. Dr. Liz Theoharris will lead a march and mass meeting in Portland on Thursday, October 10. The March will begin at Lincoln Park (350 Congress Street) at 5:45 pm, and the Mass Meeting will take place at First Parish Unitarian Universalist Church (425 Congress Street) at 7:00 pm.

Favorite Pie Crust Recipe (Enough for two, 2-crust pies)

First part:

4 cups flour
Sift together with
1 Tbsp. sugar
2 tsp. salt
Using pastry blender, cut in 1 and $\frac{3}{4}$ cups vegetable shortening

Second part:

Beat:
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup COLD water
1 Tbsp. vinegar
1 egg
Combine the two mixtures. Store in plastic wrap in refrigerator until ready to roll out.
