Notes from Pastor Geoff

At the end of forty days Noah opened the window of the ark that he had made and sent out the raven; and it went to and fro until the waters were dried up from the earth. Then he sent out the dove from him, to see if the waters had subsided from the face of the ground; but the dove found no place to set its foot, and it returned to him to the ark, for the waters were still on the face of the whole earth. So he put out his hand and took it and brought it into the ark with him. He waited another seven days, and again he sent out the dove from the ark; and the dove came back to him in the evening, and there in its beak was a freshly plucked olive leaf; so Noah knew that the waters had subsided from the earth. Then he waited another seven days, and sent out the dove; and it did not return to him any more. - Genesis 8:6–12

Dear Foreside Friends,

I have been thinking about Noah at the end of the flood a lot lately. As a child, I always appreciated the ingenuity of his little system and team of birds for tentatively feeling out the return of the earth. These days, I think I appreciate more the complexity of feelings that Noah and his passengers might have had: a shared trauma and memory of the world as it had been, the strange comfort of the tenuous security of the ark, and the anxious possibility of new life as the earth again rose to welcome them. Maybe we need some birds to send out to "test the waters" for us in these days of the pandemic!

At one level, we are in a season that instructs us in these testing times. We here in Maine are accustomed to April and May as a season where we always keep a suspicious eye on the horizon. It *is* mud season, but it is also "late snow" season, or "sudden frost" season. We keep

our gardens under the safety of leaves a little longer, and plant a little later than most... knowing that a sudden change can wound what we hope will grow. This tender way has felt familiar to Julia and I as we have returned to "life", still marked by grief, still uncertain of ourselves, but also sustained by love and care from so many, and from all of you. As Pastor Kelli said last month, crocuses have to be built to endure a world not always ready to receive them.

It is also Easter season, where we tell stories of the tentative and stumbling first steps of the disciples encountering the risen Jesus and beginning to proclaim his resurrection to the world as the Church. As we gingerly walk with them towards Pentecost, we feel out a world that is changed: one that is filled with the hope of resurrection, but has not erased the memory and sorrow of the cross.

So it is also true that, in the midst of the hope and new life of increasing rates of vaccinations against COVID–19, our staff and leadership are beginning to plan for how we might be able to gather together in person more in the coming months. And—at the same time, in the challenge and the struggle of increasing numbers of cases, and in the younger family members who are not yet vaccinated—we are confronted by the reality that the time is not yet *fully* here.

Nonetheless, in May, we will begin by resuming Wednesday Evening Prayers (weather dependent) outside at 6pm. These gatherings will still follow good protocols for health and safety, including collecting information for contact tracing, seating households at physical distance, requiring masks, and offering online worship for those who are not able to be in person with us.

This first step will allow Sunday worship to continue to be free of weather concerns and for our worship team to plan more fully how to create a meaningful "hybrid worship" experience. We want to plant ourselves and grow in the new world we are greeting on this far side of the pandemic: seeing one another in person where we can, and staying connected to the many who have been able to participate in worship more regularly *because* of online worship.

You can expect to receive another short survey (via mail or email) collecting feedback and information from you and your household in the coming weeks. Please be sure to look for this, and to complete the survey so our leadership can more fully understand what hopes or challenges they should be attentive to as they consider possibilities for worship and other programs and activities.

On May 17th, the Governing Board will meet to review the status of the pandemic, survey responses, and current policies and possible adaptations. At that time, I expect that we will share more information about how worship and other gatherings might hopefully expand in the summer months.

Like Noah, then, we will continue to "send out birds"... taking joy in each time their flight extends, each sign of growth that returns to us, and rejoicing that soon we may yet be able to renew the spiritual nest we are called to!


