Notes from Reverend Geoff Parker

Jesus said to his disciples: ...be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. – Matthew 10:16

This perplexing little invitation is inserted into Jesus's charge to his disciples before he sends them out into the world to proclaim the coming reign of God. He does this, knowing that word will not always meet with acceptance and rejoicing. In other words: Jesus is preparing his disciples to do ministry in challenging and uncertain times, foreseeing that this calling will require both shrewd and clever thinking... and the heart and compassion of the God who they were going forth to proclaim.

The coming of September always brings a jolt of energy and activity to our congregation: we who have enjoyed the warmth of the sun and the breeze coming off the bay here on the Foreside enjoy a certain pace of summer, and then we ramp up in a short time to celebrate the coming together of dear friends, and ministries, and choirs, oh my! The air almost crackles as we begin again in the rich and vibrant life of the Spirit here at Foreside Community Church.

And yet, this September is a challenging and uncertain time. The continuing grief of the novel coronavirus pandemic hovers over us. We know that behind the numbers we see on the news are real people: loved ones who have died, who have been ill, who have lost work, lost income, lost security. We know some of them closely, some of them less so... but they are still part of the fullness of the body, part of God's community, and each of those losses touch us. Those losses also challenge us to devote ourselves even more to the safety and care of others in our decisions and actions.

In August, our Governing Board—based on the continuing trends of the pandemic, the protocols necessary to assure safety, the realities of our sanctuary space and its capacities, and the call to steward the health and wellness of our congregation and the wider community—made the wise decision to continue to refrain from public worship in our sanctuary through 2020. They will evaluate the situation again in January and will share more news as they discern plans going forward.

I know that this decision is painful: that we miss each other and our beloved traditions, our gathering, and our worship. We should not sweep these feelings under the rug. They are real, and they testify to the beloved community we know here in our congregation. I also know that we have been given the chance to discover how God is yet moving in and through our lives in *new* ways in this time.

So we *will continue to be* wise as serpents and innocent, as gentle, as doves: we will continue to be creative and adaptive to be Christ's church even in these times, *so that we might continue* to care for the health and life of all, especially the most vulnerable among us. We will find along with our committed staff and ministries new ways to make our common life as a Congregation possible, and to mirror some of the richness and rejoicing that we know in times of gathering in person.

In this newsletter, you will find news of families bringing their children to the font of life and blessing. You will find news of how we continue to support our neighbors in need. You will find opportunities to worship on Sundays using all our technology, and to worship in ancient ways under "the high vault of heaven" outside together. You will find the Good News that Christmas, and indeed the Christmas Fair, is not canceled... and in fact, we may mark a few of those traditions early and extravagantly!

Above all, I hope you will find—as I have—that we have received in the God's gifts gathered here all the wisdom, and all the gentleness of spirit and of heart that we require to meet this present moment as the church, as followers of Christ, and as a part of God's beloved community here on the Foreside.

Thanks be to God, and I will see you in all the joyful gatherings—real and virtual—to come!

Summer Visitors - A Meaningful Experience (D. Blanchette)

This past summer the Foreside Community Church invited a couple from Texas to park their RV in our yard and to be our guests while they struggled to find a new home here in Maine. Joseph and Ann Wilson had found themselves in the same situation as many other Americans - serious illness forced Ann to leave her professional work and medical bills, especially for cancer treatments, caused the loss of their home, most other belongings and even the equity in Joseph's (J's) police retirement account. In addition to cancer Ann suffers from multiple sclerosis and lupus.

After the loss of almost every asset, the Wilsons moved into their ten-year-old RV and headed to Maine in the hope of finding a place where the more temperate weather would help Ann. Arriving in Maine they found themselves in urgent need of assistance. The Falmouth Food Pantry connected with them and soon after they were welcomed to our church. During their stay many individual members of our church, Justice & Outreach, and our office team offered friendship and support. J reached out to help repay us as much as possible and he worked hard with our grounds team to clean flower beds and gather trimmed tree branches. J was able to find local work with a new start-up company that has allowed him to work primarily from the RV, but the salary was insufficient to obtain an apartment. During this time, the unusually hot summer weather caused the interior of the RV to become dangerously hot. This exasperated Ann's medical condition and J's PTSD - a result of severe trauma in his work in the police force and as a former uniformed member of the U.S. Air Force. The Wilson's made the very difficult decision to return to Texas where a friend had located an accessible, affordable apartment. They arrived back in Texas at the end of August.



For those who visited with the Wilsons it became a meaningful friendship to them. They are both very intelligent, well read, compassionate, and spiritual individuals. They are still facing enormous challenges, but they are courageous and have a strong faith in God. We continue to wish them all the best.


Stewardship Musters for Grounds Maintenance (C. Ward)

The grounds around the church received some much needed attention in August starting with lilac pruning - the biggest stalks in every bush were cut down, and a lot of the dead has been removed. Additional work is needed to lower the tops to 6' feet.

The thicket of saplings and brushy stuff has been removed from behind Geoff's office - That amounted to two truckloads, no kidding. Kathy Hillman-Reed and Stan did an amazing job there, all the way from the shed to the cemetery line. Deb Coyman helped with the lilacs, also weeding and spreading compost. Mark Munson and Deb Gray were sleeves up and knee deep in the work as well.

Our parking lot lodger, Jay, was also on board both days, weeding and spreading compost as thanks for letting him stay in our lot and use our Wi-Fi. He worked hard for hours both days and is a very nice fellow. Thanks to Dotty for lining him up!

There are still several projects within the larger work plan that still needs addressing: more weeding, after the honey bees are through with the blossoms; more lilac topping which we can do with the pole saw; and loading of the truck with one more load of brush for the dump. A call for further volunteers will follow after the first October. You do not need to be a member of the Stewardship Ministry to assist!

Looking for a way to help others during this time of social distancing? Well, Justice and Outreach has an opportunity for you!

The Preble Street Teen Center in Portland works with homeless and runaway teens, or those without any supports at home, or no home. It helps meet their immediate needs: warmth and safety, nutritious meals, clothing, crisis intervention, and a dedicated shelter open every night of the year, so kids do not have to go to an adult shelter. The Center has social workers, nurses, educational support, and other trained workers to deal with the complicated lives of these young people.

During the month of **September**, Justice and Outreach will be collecting items to donate to the teen center:

- ◆ **Underwear – male and female adult sizes (The girls do like 'pretty' items!).**
- ◆ **Socks, any kind – male and female adult sizes. Winter is coming....**
- ◆ **For girls: hair care items such as barrettes and headbands.**
- ◆ **For guys: solid-colored T-shirts, any size.**

Starting the beginning of September, there will be a bin outside the side door of the church to collect your donations. The bin will be brought in every night and then placed back out the next morning. At a time when it is difficult to directly help those in need, we hope this opportunity will give you a chance to contribute.

The Falmouth Food Pantry will continue to serve clients but will not reopen the physical facilities in the foreseeable future because the space is too confined to be safe during the Pandemic. Distributions to cars will continue to take place from 9:00-10:30 a.m. the first and third Friday each month until November 20. The pantry will also continue to deliver food supplies to dozens of individual homes. Arrangements for these deliveries are made in advance and the food is delivered to the doorsteps, not into the homes. **Because it is anticipated that winter weather will not allow for the Friday car distributions we will go to an entirely home delivery service**

Christmas Fair in the time of Covid-19??

We are having to do some serious re-imagining – and here's where we stand now.....

We plan to split the fair up, into three pieces, Saturday October 17th and Saturday December 5th outside on tables, plus an on-line sale or auction. On the church side of the tables will be the volunteers, with their masks. On the street side, the customers, with their masks. Anyone without a mask will be turned away by our bouncer!

The October 17th half, held outside on tables, will include baking, knit items, craft items, and maybe take out food. There will be an opportunity to order your Thanksgiving pie, your Christmas butter crunch, your Christmas Eve chili. We'll put off the Treasures, and the jewelry, and the domestic cast-offs until next year – They attract the throngs of bargain hunters and pickers who might be unwilling to politely take turns and stay distanced. Rain date would be October 24th.

The December 5th half, on the usual first Saturday, again held outside, would feature baking, knit items, craft items, maybe take out food, and greens – wreathes, swags, table decorations, boxwood trees and bulbs, plus another signup sheet for Christmas dinner pies, chili, butter crunch. No treasures, no housewares. We can't have the hordes of shoppers – Rather we want a steady dribble of you, politely mosey-ing by, dropping some money buying things that volunteers have been making all year. No rain or snow date for December – Too close to the holidays. We will put up the wreath racks, buy a big tarp just in case, and pray!

The third half (ha-ha), would be the on line sale or auction. This is as yet amorphous, and we don't know what we would be selling. Weekends on islands or on lakes? Ski house for a weekend or a week? Nice art? Higher priced items would be necessary to offset the cost of setting the sale up. Maybe there is another way we can do it. All ideas welcomed.

We will have all these details ironed out by the October *Steeplenotes* – Stay tuned!


Our hope is we can do a second round of these in person coffee hours in October (or more if they are popular). We are all looking forward to catching up with you and hearing about your summer.
