Notes from Reverend Geoff Parker

The Foundations

I have to admit, when I first arrived here at Foreside Community Church, I did not spend a lot of time thinking about the patio. I had been here to visit a few times before, and really it didn't even register as it's own space... it was just space before I reached the office door. I remember the day I was called to serve here: Susan Gilpin graciously hosting Julia and I as the congregation discerned the call... it was a delightful visit... Yet I had no idea how central this place would become to my ministry... Not surprisingly, at this point: COVID-19 has drastically altered our spaces, our gatherings, and our patterns for ministry.

Each week now, I record some of our worship service here, encouraged by the work of Susan Gilpin and Carol Ward, who helped "set the scene" for me this summer with a simple birch cross and flowers to add some life besides the pastor! I gather with church members, staff, and others to talk... I'll sometimes sit and write, sometimes take in the sound of trumpets or piano wafting from inside the sanctuary.

Among all the other gratitudes of a day being your pastor, and enjoying the beauty of our little spot on the Foreside (though not the drought conditions that have made for so many beautiful days!)... I find myself giving thanks from time to time for the stones on the far side of the patio.

I confess, I do not yet know the story of these stones, how they came to define the rough seating of my little chapel which is suddenly so central to my—and our—worship lives. I can only tell that they are not there by accident: rough hewn, certainly, but neatly formed into two semi-circular rows to be able to seat visitors and shape the space.

As we journey into another season of being church you could do worse for a foundation: a sign of someone offering a simple gift of earth to welcome and center people for worship. I wonder if the donor of these stones could have imagined what they would come to mean to us in the midst of a pandemic in the year 2020. Someday, I invite you to come have a seat for a moment, and give thanks for the grounding, the "foundation" which has been laid, and which we now build on in our sudden need to use outdoor spaces differently.

This is the way of the life of faith, of gratitude, and of giving: we offer what we can to God with thanksgiving, in the hopes of strengthening our common life and ministry. Frequently we are unaware of what those gifts will mean to others... and to those who will come after us.

On October 4th, we'll launch our annual appeal for pledges for the coming year of our life together as a congregation. This year, our theme is *How Firm a Foundation*, as we give thanks for the solid grounding of connection and care, and shared talents and skills which have allowed our ministry to not just survive, but in many ways thrive, in this challenging time for many of us, and for our nation and world. In the year to come, we hope to build on that foundation: to reconnect with our cherished traditions while not losing sight of the valuable things we have learned. When the time is right, we will share worship and programming where we might gather, yes!, but also continue to serve "alongside" people

far off from us, and reach our own congregation when we cannot otherwise be together.

I hope you will pause in this month to give thanks for those who have laid foundations for our community in the past, and prayerfully discern how you might be able to share gifts from your life as we continue to build beloved community here. We know that the fullness of the gift given is not its size, but its spirit, and trust that like the stones which I visit with each week—our gifts find purpose and meaning we cannot even imagine. Above all, I hope you know how much I give thanks to God for the gift of community which holds us close, even in these days, and which sustains us as we rejoice in the Holy Spirit in our church.

Church members will be behind the tables, customers in front. Payment will be taken in cash or by credit card. **Hours are 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.** and we hope you all drop by during the morning! *We <u>will</u> have a coffee pot going, to go with the baked goodies!*

Orders may be taken for Thanksgiving PIES, and Phil's famous chili, and possibly Deb's famous butter crunch. If we have run out of either in previous years, you are in luck – You can be sure with a solid pre-paid order this year!

Finally, we have another unique participation option this year – If you would have made a pie, but just can't bring yourself to do it this year, you can just send in a check for \$15, with "I don't want to bake!" in the memo line! Similarly, if you don't want to knit a hat and scarf, send in a check for \$50! And if you don't want to donate or buy a sailboat ride, send in \$100! How easy could that be.....

Are you willing to bake APPLE, PUMPKIN, or PE-CAN pies for Thanksgiving pickup? You would deliver your pie(s) to the church between 8 and 10AM on Tuesday, November 24. Those who have purchased your pies in advance will pick them up from the church between 10 AM and noon on the 24th. From this, we will create a list of pies available for purchase. Buyers can then sign for the pies and pay for them at the October 17 outdoor sale.

Please also consider baking something for the baked goods table at the October 17 sale. Individually wrapped items such as hand pies, whoopie pies, brownies, seasonal cookies, small plates of baked goodies, and homemade breads would work well. We will need to have things properly wrapped so that no hands touch the food. We also won't be able to handle anything that requires refrigeration. Contact either Claudia or Margaret if you plan to contribute. You can simply bring your contributions to the church the day of the outdoor sale. You can price your contributions yourself or have us do that.



The Falmouth Food Pantry will continue to serve clients but will not reopen the physical facilities in the foreseeable future because the space is too confined to be safe during the Pandemic. Distributions to cars will continue to take place from 9:00-10:30 a.m. the first and third Friday each month until November 20. The pantry will also continue to deliver food supplies to dozens of individual homes. Arrangements for these deliveries are made in advance and the food is delivered to the doorsteps, not into the homes. Because it is anticipated that winter weather will not allow for the Friday car distributions we will go to an entirely home delivery service and will need volunteers willing to assist with our expanded home delivery program starting in Decem-If you are interested please contact Dorothy ber.
