## **Notes from Pastor Geoff**

## Lent: In the Shadow / In the Shelter

The season of Lent begins next week with Ash Wednesday, March 2nd. We mark ourselves with the reminder of the fragility of human life, and the certainty of God's grace.

As we move into Lent, I hope that this season invites you into a quieter time of noticing where you are in this journey of life and faith. As the author of our Lenten book study, Padraig Ó Tuama, reflects on the story of a friend, he recalls her return to an area of Papua New Guinea she was born into but then traveled away from:

There was no word for "hello" in this local language in Papua New Guinea. Instead, upon seeing someone, one simply said, "You are here." The answer, as I recall it, was equally straightforward: "Yes I am." Whether by fact or fiction, it remains that for decades I have thought of the words "You are here" and "Yes I am" as good places to begin something that might be called prayer. - Padraig Ó Tuama, In the Shelter

**So, join our own Rev. Kelli Whitman as she leads our Ash Wednesday service March 2nd at 6:00 pm.** Come to this quiet time of worship to notice where you are, and listen for where God might be calling you to move into.

I also hope that Lent invites you into a time of "re-telling," as well. You are invited to join me on Sunday mornings or Wednesday evenings for our study as we read *In the Shelter*, Ó Tuama's book in which he reminds his readers that we are called to confront our past readings or translations of the stories of our lives, and of the scriptures. Those stories may be heard and seen anew, and may change us.

"Ar scáth a chéile a mhaireas na daoine," ... is an Irish saying that translates in one way as "It is in the shelter of each other that the people live." Another way to translate it is "It is in the shadow of each other that the people live." The word scáth can mean both shelter and shadow.

How many of us are aware of those parts of our lives that can be seen from both perspectives? How can they, in this holy season, be transformed from one to the other, from shadow to shelter?

**On Sunday, March 13th, we will invite children to return to Sunday School.** It has been two long years since we were last able to gather with children in the sanctuary. I know I am excited to be able to sit together and to hear the voices of our young people in worship! I am looking forward to hearing the ways in which they have made their own stories new in the past few years... in the challenges, and the blessings they may have noticed along the way. They, and we, have known shadow and shelter—and it is with each other we may seek the latter over the former.

An important note on worship registration: Since children will depart for church school relatively quickly, families do not need to include them in their number attending worship when registering ahead of time.

Into this Lent, then, this season of noticing, of listening, and of re-telling our stories—and ourselves—into the great story of God's love... you are invited, friends.

Lent, the season leading to Holy Week and Easter, is often named a season of repentance. To repent, though,

really means "to change direction." Or, we could say, to begin to tell a new story. Now, in-between the challenging days that have been in the last years, and the days we hope to come, what is the new story we are being called to begin to tell in our lives... with God? With each other? With ourselves? What old stories do we need to reframe or release? And, how can we practice telling this new story?

Starting March 6th or 9th, join Pastor Geoff for a Lenten reflection series, either Sundays (in person after church) or Wednesday evenings (by Zoom) to pray, reflect together and individually, and perhaps even write (though you need not be a "writer!") We'll read In the Shelter, the spiritual memoir of the Irish poet, theologian, and leader Padraig O'Tuama. With O'Tuama, we'll wonder at the power of words and stories—in our lives and in the scriptures—and God's invitation to tell a new story through us.

We work directly with our pastor, to take part in the conduct of each church service. Ministers of Worship perform the Call to Worship, share the Prayer of Offertory Dedication, and read the Scriptures each Sunday prior to the sermon. We also have the privilege of offering Communion, assisting the pastor in this monthly sacrament, and so ministering to our fellow church members.

The experience of worship is also enhanced with sanctuary design and decoration, depending on the season and liturgical calendar. This is a wonderful way to creatively invite and deepen our spiritual experience.

In this time of Covid and its pandemic restrictions, we have continued working closely with Pastor to record online services. Preparing the sanctuary, reaching out to parishioners personally, leading Calls to Worship, Offertory Prayers, and Scripture readings on video, is how we have sustained our commitment to worshiping together in these unusual times.

Now, with our welcome return to hybrid services – which includes both online and in person worship, we are resuming our roles as greeters and facilitators of Sunday services.

With a core team of determined volunteers and the generosity of Allagash Brewing Company, a nocontact car distribution system was established.
