PASTORAL NOTES

Rest...

Dear Foreside Friends,

The heat is here, summer has arrived, and I suspect for many of you house guests may not be far behind. Often, that feels like a time of busy-ness, I know. But I hope that summer here for our community also invites that most challenging spiritual practice, rest and renewal. Our traditions and scripture embed in our common life patterns of great activity and great stillness: God creates for six days, and rests on the 7th; the prophet Elijah, hounded and hunted, hears God in the sound of sheer silence; and indeed, the silence of the tomb sits close to the sights and sounds of Easter resurrection; searching Advent becomes joyous Christmas and Epiphany, quiet Lent gives ways to Easter's trumpet blasts.

These patterns mimic and mirror the patterns that our ancestors found around them: sun and moon, growth and retreat, the lengthening and shortening of days, the change of seasons. All these patterns are a gift. If all was sun, nothing would grow. If plants only flourished, the soil would be depleted. Here is wisdom of our faith, and wisdom of "the Book of the World."

So it is for us. We need both meaningful work and activity, and meaningful (and sometimes meaningless!) rest: both as a theological statement of our worth and belovedness apart from our productivity, and also a necessary component of full flourishing and growth.

In keeping with this pattern, **Prayers on the Patio begin Sunday, July 6th and continue through the month.** The ritual of moving our worship to the outdoors, and sharing leadership in a more informal setting and structure of worship has become a cherished tradition of this season. This year we give thanks to worship leaders John Bischof, the Green Team, and Kathie McCatherin for sharing their gifts with us. (And I would invite *you* to reflect on if you might be called to lead a service or a portion of one in the future!)

I will be away from the church for my own rest and renewal from July 1 - July 20. Pastoral Care is available and will be coordinated during this time through the gifts of our own Rev. Joan Murray, who you can connect with through the office or at (781) 540–4503. I hope you will join me in giving thanks for this gift which Joan shares with us in the summer, offering her own caring presence, and the presence of God, to our community members in time of need.

... and Renewal!

As we prepare to rest, it can be a lovely thing to look forward to a new time of activity to come! After a year of watching to see what might grow, the Christian Education Ministry and I have a happy announcement. It is our joy to share that dear friend of our congregation, Elise Wulff, has accepted the position as our next Youth and Families Ministry Coordinator. In that role, she will help to lead Sunday School classes, as well as coordinate the efforts of our incredible volunteer teachers. Elise will also work collegially with the CE team on additional programming, and help tend to the church's relationship and communication with families in our work of creating a beloved community in learning.

Elise shares that she is thrilled to be joining the team and grateful to have the opportunity to give back to this exceptional community. Currently with Mass General Brigham, she has worked in education for more than 20 years, with specific training and expertise in creating inclusive environments, social-emotional learning, and parent/caregiver support. She works locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally as a consultant and speaker to support schools of all models, organizations, community settings, and corporations to enhance their accessibility and inclusion. Most important to Elise is that individuals feel valued for who they are and encouraged to be curious in learning about themselves and others.

This opportunity comes as Elise and her family: Bryan Gattis Wulff, Orlie, and Robin Jay, complete their final stage of moving to Falmouth year-round. As such, we can certainly understand all the wobbly and wondering feelings that can come with major transitions and changes (even welcome ones), and hold them in prayer and support as they get settled into life here among us full-time.
