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PASTORAL NOTES

...if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself... - 2 Corinthians 5 17-19

Dear Foreside friends,

As the warm days come to us and mud season begins to recede into the newness of fresh grass, we continue to grow into the season of Easter here. Faithful teams of volunteers began last month by “planting” eggs in the church yard and ended by clearing away winter’s sand for spring’s new growth.

At least here in the northern hemisphere, we’re blessed that these gifts of nature and beauty each spring arrive as part of the “already but not yet” work of Easter. The creation around us re-enacts the resurrection: reminding us that God’s story—and hence, our story—does not end in death, but is continually renewed.

That renewal of life creates new possibility: opening our own hope, faith, and love... including hope for the reconciliation God has been and is working in Christ. We are invited to love more wholly within ourselves, within our relationships as human persons, but also as creatures living in and with the world: a relationship that we know is fragile and fraught in our current times.

Tending that connection between us as a people and the world in which we live and listening for how we can be a site of God’s reconciling work has been a focus for our congregation this program year, exploring a possible **Covenant of Right Relationship with the Earth**. We have engaged in a process of discernment: learning together in a variety of settings and formats, listening to one another and the Spirit moving within us in a variety of community reflection sessions, and creating commitment led by our covenant writing team through feedback and reflection sessions.

The hope has been to express how our church understands Christ’s call to us as a community in which we find so much meaning in creation, and as we move forward striving for wholeness with the natural (or “more than human”) world. Here is one product of that work, in the form of covenant promises we make as the church, which the Governing Board now recommends for your consideration at our **annual meeting on May 17th**. I hope that you will join us for this time of discernment and decision.

As Christ is, indeed, risen, may we rise into newness of connection and communion with the world we are blessed to share in.



Covenant of Right Relationship with the Earth

As members of Foreside Community Church, United Church of Christ, we recognize that we and all creation are made in the image of God. We acknowledge that a core purpose of our faith is to care for God's intricate and wondrously evolving universe that gave birth to our planet Earth and her interdependent seas, skies, flora, fauna, and human existence.

We are grateful to live and worship in a place that nurtures strong connections with fields and forests, mountains and gardens, watersheds and rivers, islands and bays. Many in our faith community derive deep enjoyment and spiritual inspiration through the beauty, richness and healing power of the natural environment that surrounds us and of which we are a part. In turn, our local lands and waters are interconnected with the more than human world and its many wild inhabitants.

Remembering God's covenant to care for the well-being of every living creature, we promise that we will seek right relationship with all of God's creation.

We promise to celebrate and deepen our bonds with the natural world. We also promise to explore the complex environmental challenges before us with curiosity and respect, dedicating ourselves to discern our own conscience and call to action, while partnering with and hoping to benefit the wider community.

We promise to support one another as many of us strive to make conscious choices for sustainable living and to overcome despair and complacency. As we do so, we promise to draw on the power and possibilities of our common life in prayer, worship, education, fellowship, justice and outreach.

We hope, with humility and relying on God's continuing guidance, to envision how human ingenuity and love can create a future that blesses and supports all life.

Health and Safety Team Updates

This year, the Governing Board as created an Ad Hoc team to consider and make recommendations for policies and procedures related to the health and safety of the congregation. This small group brings the gift of skills and experience from emergency services, education, public safety, and medicine. The group

Procedures for inventory and resupply of first aid supplies for kitchen, Sunday School, etc.

Adding an additional Automated External Defibrillator to our campus.

Re-establishment of fire safety drills.

Preparing Basic Life Support (CPR, etc.) training to staff and volunteers in the fall.

Preparing training and procedures for active intruder scenarios.

In addition, this group helped to recommend the procedures for visits / execution of warrants from law enforcement agents to our campus earlier this year. You can review those procedures below.

Law and Immigration Enforcement Visits

If immigration or other law enforcement arrives at the church: Foreside Community Church's sanctuary is open to all by default and is considered a "public" space. No warrant is required for agents to enter the sanctuary.

Ministers of Worship or other frontline Staff and Volunteers:

Greet law enforcement agents calmly in the narthex, saying, "I am not authorized to assist you. Please wait while I contact one of our leaders." Refer the officers to the Pastor or another officer of the church. Volunteers may come to the front of the church and speak quietly to the pastor if worship is in progress. If agents follow or insist on coming into the church do not attempt to obstruct or interfere. Remain calm and help to set that tone for the congregation.

Pastor or other Officer of the Church:

Ask all public and members to remain calm and in their seats. Greet agents, ask how we may assist them. If presented with a warrant of any kind, ask to make a copy and document all relevant badge numbers, and other details as soon as possible. Allow access to facilities as indicated by the form and content of the warrant.

Agents may choose to conduct a valid I-9 audit. The Pastor, as supervisor of all staff, will assist with copies of current and past I-9 forms for that audit.

Worship Staff:

Assist the Pastor in maintaining calm and attention of all public and members present.

Sunday School Staff:

Consolidate nursery and Sunday School into the large classroom and close the door. Staff retain care of all children throughout the visit.

May Justice & Outreach Mission Moment

In these challenging times for our country and especially New Mainers, we want and need helpers to be right here among us. Since January of 2025 our immigrant neighbors and friends are facing many new dangers and their need for assistance is greater than ever. ILAP (Immigrant Legal Advocacy Project) Maine's only state-wide immigration legal services organization was founded in 1993 as a volunteer lawyer project providing assistance to about two dozen asylum seekers. Over the years since, ILAP has become a 501(C)(3) organization and now reaches more than 1,000. Mainers each year. The organization also are connected to more than 150 immigrant children from difficult backgrounds that they assist in a variety of ways.

On May 24, Marjorie Hankle from ILAP has been invited by Justice & Outreach to address many of the questions about

how the work of ILAP continues and has adapted as a consequence of the heightened immigration enforcement. We will hear together how ILAP is assisting immigrants and their families through direct legal service, community education, and through policy reform even at the government level. Please plan to remain for coffee hour to share your questions and hear more from Marjorie. Thank you.

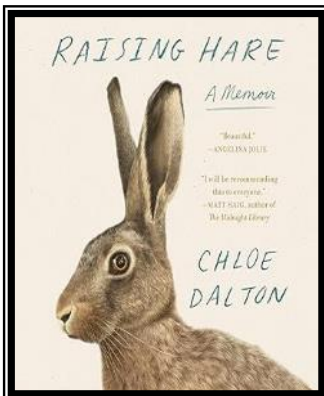
### ***FCC Book Club Updates***

The FCC book club will end this season of reading on May 20 when we will be discussing Raising Hare: a Memoir by Chloe Dalton.

*"Imagine you could hold a baby hare and bottle-feed it. Imagine that it lived under your roof and lolloped around your bedroom at night, drumming on the duvet cover when it wanted your attention. Imagine that, over two years later, it still ran in from the fields when you called it and snoozed in your house for hours on end. This happened to me." (Chloe Dalton)*

"When lockdown led busy professional Chloe to leave the city and return to the countryside of her childhood, she never expected to find herself custodian of a newly born hare. Yet when she finds the creature, endangered, alone and no bigger than her palm, she is compelled to give it a chance at survival. Raising Hare chronicles their journey together and the challenges of caring for the leveret and preparing for its return to the wild. We witness an extraordinary relationship between human and animal, rekindling our sense of awe towards nature and wildlife. 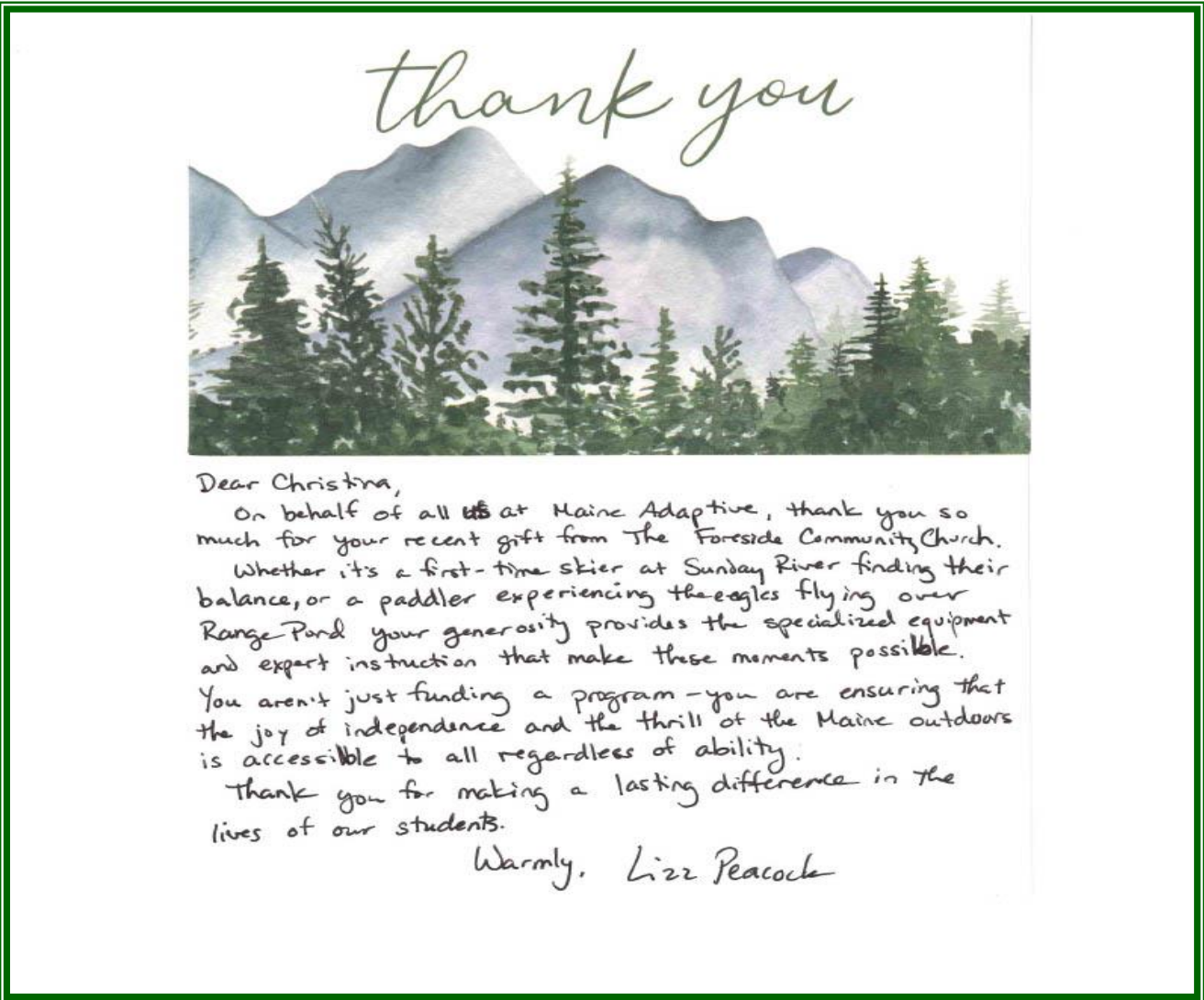

This past March, FCC's Justice & Outreach Ministry contributed \$500.00 to the Maine Adaptive Program to help this amazing non-profit support its stated mission. Please read on to learn of the incredible results...

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Justice & Outreach members-

2026 Maine Adaptive (MASR) winter is over with a wonderfully successful season. From small beginnings in 1982 at Sunday River we are now a large diverse cadre of volunteers backed by a small dedicated staff, all committed to this nonprofit 30+ years later. We continue to entice growing numbers of hopeful adaptive athletes with new possibilities to challenge & empower them with free outdoor experiences all 4 seasons. Here's a peek


(peak! ) at what took place on several Maine ski mountains plus snowshoe and cross country trails since January. MASR hosted 26 veterans for our Veterans No Boundaries program, then held its annual NEVI Fest (New England Visual Impaired Festival), and also several mono ski camps (mono skis empower those with lower limb disabilities). There was even one mono camp for youth with these disabilities. PAll this was on top of daily Adaptive ski/ snowboard offerings all season at our home base, Sunday River & 2 other ski mountains. Our specialized equipment continue to expand in support of a broader range of disabilities.

This is all possible because of your generosity. I'll close by saying we reached beyond our audacious campaign goal and raised over \$380,000, making quite a statement about a huge caring adaptive community in Maine & beyond.
